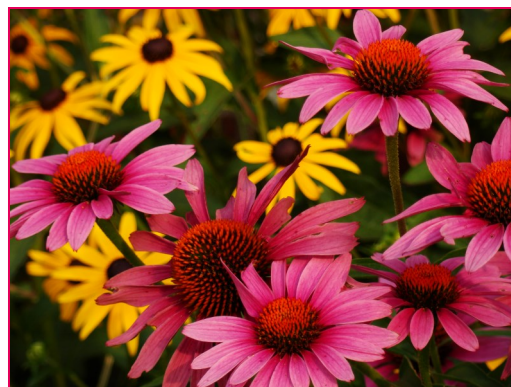

Please note that deer resistant doesn't mean deer proof! Plus, some plants fall prey to other wild-life like groundhogs and rabbits.

Several plant species have a wide range of growing conditions. For example, some plants can handle shade, but bloom better in full sun. Remember, you can always move your plants!

The National Wildlife Federation has a Native Plant Finder tool that will help landowners identify which plants are native to their zip code and what species of butterflies and moths are known to utilize those plants, at genus level, as hosts for their caterpillars. ### Paw Paw

(*Asimina triloba*)

**Bloom:** April – May

**Height:** up to 30 feet

**Light:** Sun – part sun

**Soil:** Wet – Moderate

**Attracts:** Wildlife

**Deer Resistant:** Yes

**Host to:** 10 caterpillar species

### Buttonbush

(*Cephalanthus occidentalis*)

**Attracts:** Bees, Butterflies

## Blue Vervain

(*Verbena hastata*)

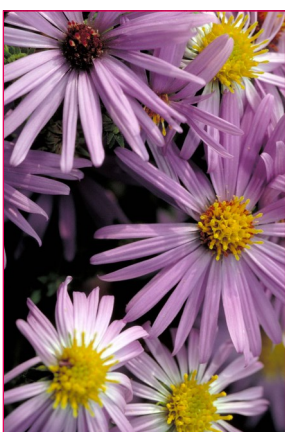

## Butterfly Weed

(*Asclepias tuberosa*)

**Soil:** Moderate – Dry

**Attracts:** Butterflies, bees

**Deer Resistant:** Yes

**Host to:** 13 caterpillar species



## Black-eyed Susan

(*Rudbeckia hirta*)

**Soil:** Medium wet – Med dry

**Attracts:** Birds, insects

**Deer Resistant:** Yes

**Host to:** 18 caterpillar species



## Cardinal Flower

(*Lobelia cardinalis*)

**Attracts:** Hummingbirds, bees

## Blue Mistflower

(*Conoclinium coelestinum*)

**Attracts:** Bees, butterflies

## Common Milkweed

(*Asclepias syriaca*)

**Soil:** Medium wet – Dry

**Attracts:** Monarchs, pollinators

**Deer Resistant:** Yes

**Host to:** 13 caterpillar species

(*Liatrix spicata*)  
**Bloom:** July – September  
**Height:** up to 5 feet  
**Light:** Sun – part sun  
**Soil:** Wet – Moderately moist  
**Attracts:** Bees, butterflies  
**Deer Resistant:** Yes



**Late Figwort**  
(*Scrophularia marilandica*)  
**Bloom:** July – October  
**Height:** 6 feet  
**Light:** Sun – Shade  
**Soil:** Medium – Med dry  
**Attracts:** Bees, hummingbirds  
**Deer Resistant:** Yes  
**Host to:** 5 caterpillar species



**Foxglove Beardtongue**  
(*Penstemon digitalis*)  
**Bloom:** June – July  
**Height:** 4 feet  
**Light:** Sun – part sun  
**Soil:** Medium – Medium dry  
**Attracts:** Bees, hummingbirds  
**Deer Resistant:** Yes  
**Host to:** 10 caterpillars



**New England Aster**  
(*Symphyotrichum novae-angliae*)  
**Bloom:** August – October  
**Height:** up to 5 feet  
**Light:** Sun – part sun  
**Soil:** Wet – Moderately dry  
**Attracts:** Pollinators, birds

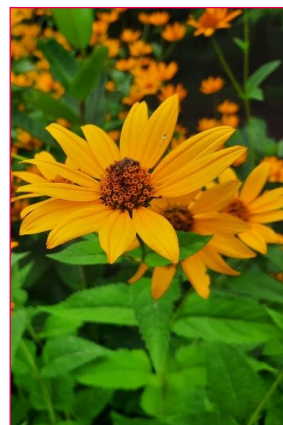
**Great Blue Lobelia**

**New York Ironweed**  
(*Vernonia noveboracensis*)  
**Bloom:** July – September  
**Height:** 6 feet  
**Light:** Sun – part sun  
**Soil:** Medium wet – Medium  
**Attracts:** Butterflies, birds  
**Deer Resistant:** Yes  
**Host to:** 24 caterpillar species



**Hoary Skullcap**  
(*Scutellaria incana*)

**Host to:** 20 caterpillar species



**Scarlet Bee Balm**

*(Monarda didyma)*

**Bloom:** June – September

**Height:** up to 4 feet

**Light:** Sun – part sun

**Soil:** Medium wet – Medium

**Attracts:** Hummingbirds, bees

**Deer Resistant:** Yes

**Host to:** 11 caterpillar species



**Spotted Bee Balm**

*(Monarda punctata)*

**Bloom Range:** July – September

**Height:** up to 2 feet

**Light:** Sun – part sun

**Soil:** Moderately dry – Dry

**Attracts:** Bees

**Deer Resistant:** Yes

**Host to:** 11 caterpillar species



**Showy Aster**

*(Aster spectabilis)*

**Bloom:** August – October

**Height:** 2 feet

**Light:** Sun – part sun

**Soil:** Medium wet – Dry

**Attracts:** Pollinators

**Deer Resistant:** Yes



**Spotted Joe Pye Weed**

*(Eutrochium maculatum)*

**Bloom:** July – September

**Height:** 6 feet

**Showy Goldenrod**

*(Solidago speciosa)*

**Bloom Range:** Sept – Nov

**Soil:** Moderate – Dry

**Attracts:** Bees, butterflies, birds

**Deer Resistant:** Yes

**Host to:** 126 caterpillar species



**Sundial Lupine**

*(Lupinus perennis)*

**Bloom Range:** May – July

**Height:** 2 feet

**Light:** Sun – part sun

**Soil:** Medium dry – Dry

**Attracts:** Karner blue butterfly

**Deer Resistant:** Yes

**Host to:** 28 caterpillar species





### Swamp Milkweed

(*Asclepias incarnata*)

**Bloom:** June – August

**Height:** 4 feet

**Light:** Sun – Shade

**Soil:** Wet – Moderate

**Attracts:** Butterflies, bees

**Deer Resistant:** Yes

**Host to:** 13 caterpillar species



### Wild Bergamot

(*Monarda fistulosa*)

**Bloom Range:** July – Sept

**Height:** up to 4 feet

**Light:** Sun – part sun

**Soil:** Moderately wet – Dry

**Attracts:** Hummingbirds

**Deer Resistant:** Yes

**Host to:** 11 caterpillar species



### Virginia Spiderwort

(*Tradescantia virginiana*)

**Bloom:** May – July

**Height:** 2 feet

**Light:** Sun – part sun

**Soil:** Moderately dry – Dry

**Attracts:** Bees

**Deer Resistant:** Yes

**Host to:** 4 caterpillar species



### Wild Senna

(*Senna hebecarpa*)

**Bloom:** July – August

**Height:** 5 feet

**Light:** Sun – part sun

**Soil:** Medium wet – Medium

**Attracts:** Pollinators

**Deer Resistant:** No

**Host to:** 5 caterpillar species
